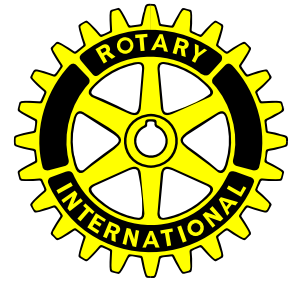

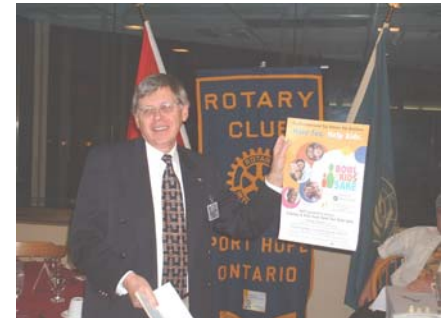
DESSERT REPORTS

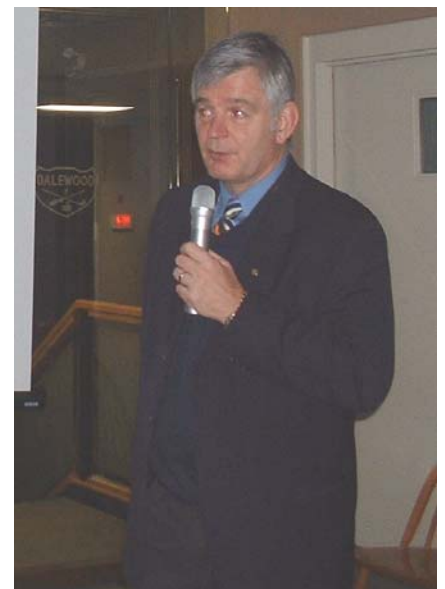
Rotarian Joyce volunteered a happy buck for the ticket sales to continue for Bordello Night and Rotarian Trish

PROGRAM



Rotarian Norm introduced our guest speakers, Joanne Ashley and Ray Richardson from the Whitby Rotary Club. They each in turn proceeded to explain their involvement with RADAR – Rotary Action Development Aids Response.



With slides, Rotarian Ray described the Howard Hospital in Zimbabwe where Dr. Thistle and Dr. Silverman look after a catch basin of 250,000 people. This hospital is maintained by three organizations; the Salvation Army in Zimbabwe, Ve'ahavta in Toronto, and Rotary Clubs in Canada (Whitby Rotary, Whitby Sunrise, Belleville and Scarborough Rotary who match grants with CRCID funding). He spoke of the number of AIDS /HIV cases this funding has helped as a result of the African HIV lab. Ray and his family spent three weeks in Zimbabwe in Mar. 2006. They took six hockey bags filled with basic medical supplies and he stated that in the middle of so much pessimism, they still had fun. They'd see numerous vehicles in the streets, but no fuel to run them. Fuel for the doctors' vehicle costs \$9000.00 per quarter year and this is what Ray has been trying to raise. The Belleville hospital has collected 40 containers of used hospital equipment to ship and Ray mentioned that the Salvation Army involvement allows for duty free shipment.

Then Joanne Ashley spoke about writing the RADAR proposal in Dec. 2003.



The symbolic word "radar" being chosen at it refers to a means of detection and was also instrumental in ending the war. Stephen Lewis and leading AIDS people endorsed the concept. The proposal engages Rotarians at a grass root level. She described being at a luncheon with Stephen Lewis in Jan. 2004 where Paige Peddler, seven years old, presented "Who Will Cuddle Them When They Sleep" referring to all the HIV/AIDS orphans.

Joanne's compassion was evident as she referred to "Grandmothers to Grandmothers", the fact that AIDS has been with us for 25 years, and her commitment to separating fact from fiction. Social consciousness is necessary. The four ways AIDS is spread is through blood contamination, unprotected sex, sharing needles, and mother to child through pregnancy and breast-feeding. In Africa, it is a cultural necessary to breast-feed infants and "women have become the face of AIDS" Eliminating

poverty and providing education are key elements. Joanne is on the District Advisory Committee and will be speaking at the District Conference in October and in his thank you to Joanne and Ray, Rotarian Ken O'Neill expressed his enthusiasm and appreciation for this proposal being started in our district through the efforts of Joanne. AIDS/HIV is the "worst health crisis the world has known"



Rotarian Ben reminded everyone of the "Night of 1000 Dinners" on April 2nd at "the Palm" where 10% of our dinner bill will be donated on behalf of the restaurant to the eradication of landmines. President elect Ron asked Rotarian Jim Hunt to lead us singing O Canada to close and complete a very informative meeting.
