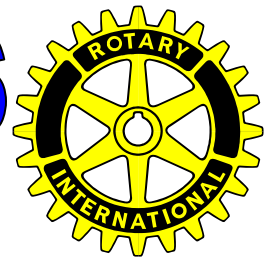

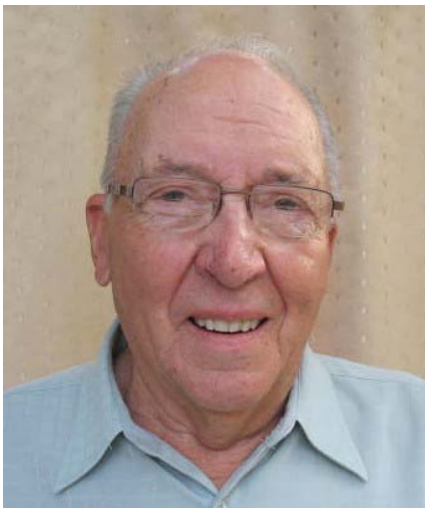

ROTARIAN PROFILE

Ted Lacey was raised on a farm just west of Camborne. After his schooling he joined the Canadian Air Force and spent 2 years in England with Bomber Command as an Air Gunner. On returning home he attended Ryerson College in a special construction course. For 12 years he owned a home building construction company in Port Hope. When Highway 401 was continued east from Newcastle he started a Ready-Mix Concrete plant in Port Hope to supply concrete for the bridges and culverts.



At this time he joined Port Hope Rotary as he was extremely interested in handicapped children. He was Chair of that committee for many years. He

willingly helped with all Club projects. He drove the PH Rotary President in Town parades. When he joined Rotary the main fund raising project was organizing a Street Fair in the Town Hall Park.

As his business grew concrete mixing plants in Campbellford, Bowmanville and Peterborough were added. Ted retired in 1986. Retirement did not defer his volunteerism as for over 20 years he drove Cancer and Community Care patients to a number of area hospitals from Kingston to Toronto.

Ted was on the United Church Board for 20 years and on the Dalewood Golf Club Board for 10. He has been a member of the A.A.C.A. car club for over 30 years. In 2005 Ted was honoured by his fellow Port Hopeians as Citizen of the Year and he is also the recipient of a Rotary Paul Harris Fellow. Marg and he have 3 grown children and 3 grandchildren.

PROGRAM

We have heard Kelly Morgan-MacKenzie speak to the Club previously about her trip to China to test 150 children for hearing disabilities, but it was so interesting to learn how she arrived at her present vocation and to feel her compassion for this profession. As Kelly was in the hospital as much as she was at home for her first five years, she attributes this and her grandfather telling her "you take care of people and the money will take care of itself" for much of her empathy and compassion towards her profession.

On one time, Kelly had a thriving modeling career becoming the L'Oreal magazine girl and she also was elevated through various sales positions, but it was what was supposed to be a temporary summer position with her parents audiology office that convinced her she wanted to work in this field. She received her audiologist certification when she was eight months pregnant with her third child. Kelly continued taking courses including an undergraduate course in counselling. She now is a member of the Conestoga College Faculty and is active volunteering with the Port Hope Heritage Business Improvement Area.

Her business, Sound Solutions, on John Street, has been established for four years now and three years ago she moved her family from Peterborough to Port Hope and she enthusiastically adds "it has been a great move for myself and the kids"!

Through the Canadian Hearing Foundation each fall Kelly visits the grade six classes throughout our schools advising students about the damage of loud sounds and music.

She mentioned again her work in China where children who cannot hear are not allowed to attend school – where in 10 days she tests 150 children. She travels here at her own expense and calls this her holiday!!

Kelly closed her presentation with stating how pleased and honoured she was to be asked to sit on the H.R. Stevens committee.

A very warm and compassionate thank you by Joe James was directed to Kelly with the rest of the members expressing their appreciation for her presentation.

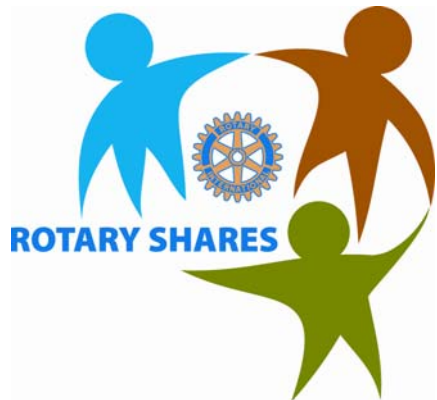
